

Japanese Honeysuckle Lonicera japonica





Appearance

twining climbing vine or groundcover 16-29 ft high, 3-6 ft wide light brown bark, peels in large strips

Foliage

deciduous, semi-evergreen opposite, green, glossy, elliptical to ovate

Flowers

present from late spring to fall gold/yellow, white, trumpet/tubular

Fruit

present in fall and summer start green, then red, ripen to blue-black

Ecological Threat

native to Eastern Asia twines around vertical supports smothering and killing vegetation girdles shrubs and trees
