

Roundleaf Greenbrier Smilax rotundifolia





Appearance

deciduous to semi-evergreen

strong tendrils at joints, stiff thorns along vines 6 to 30 ft. long

Foliage

green, glossy - upper surface darker than underside glabrous, rounded, alternate

3-5 veins per leaf

Flowers

greenish white, umbels of 3-20

male and female flowers do not occur on the same plant

Fruit

present in the fall

blue-black with white bloom at maturity

Ecological Threat

native to central and southeastern USA

grows rapidly in low light to get established in underbrush once established they grow over and up shrubs and trees
