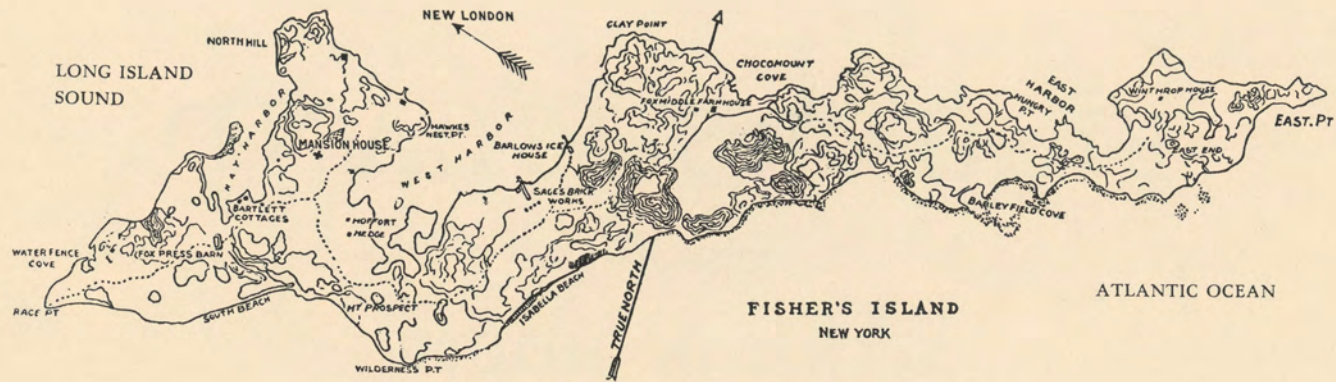

Picturesque Fishers Island

Mansion House and Cottages



ISHERS ISLAND, New York, is located at the meeting of Long Island Sound and the Atlantic Ocean, forty minutes by boat from New London, Connecticut—a delightful sail down the Thames River with its beautiful shores and fine summer homes, and across Fishers Island Sound to Fishers Island. The Island is nine miles in length, the width varying from a mile to a mile and a half, irregular in form with many projecting headlands and small bays. In contour it is pleasantly rolling, with an elevation of one hundred and forty feet above sea level at its highest point.

The Island abounds in springs of sparkling freshness which insure the Mansion House an unfailing source of pure water. Seven fresh water lakes dot the Island. Beautiful trees and shrubbery, cool, ocean-swept breezes create a combination of country and sea shore unsurpassed for summer colonists.

The Hay Harbor Club, center of the Island's activities, with golf, tennis, bathing and boating, is situated within a few minutes' walk of the hotel and cottages. The location, its wide porches for afternoon teas and bridge parties, together with its excellent service, makes it an attractive and popular rendezvous. There are seven well-kept tennis courts, with locker rooms for guests. Bathing, boating and yachting facilities are unexcelled.

Children's Safety—The shallow water on the wide sand bar provides a safe place for the children to wade and sail their small boats.

Bathing—A large swimming pool has been dredged and is supplied with constantly refreshed water with the action of the tides providing an opportunity for swimming and diving at all times with a depth of twelve feet at low tide. There are also many delightful places to swim for those who do not venture into deep water. A dock has been constructed leading from the bath houses to the swimming pool.

Fishing—The fishing in the immediate vicinity of the Island is good and all varieties of fish common to this latitude can be caught.

Boating—Little Hay Harbor is a sheltered bay for small boats, motor boats, skiddoos (sailed by the youngsters) and the One-Design boats. The boats of this latter class race once or twice a week outside the harbor and have many exciting contests for cups that are awarded the winners.

Golf—Overlooking the Ocean is a sporty, nine-hole golf course with rolling fairways swept by cool breezes. A well-appointed club house with locker rooms and showers is conveniently located.

Mansion House—The Mansion House, modern and up-to-date with elevator, provides rooms with bath and are fully and comfortably furnished. A telephone is installed in each room for local or long distance calls.

Cuisine—The House is noted for its excellent table, careful attention being given to every detail. Fresh milk, cream, eggs and vegetables and the choicest of meats and poultry. Fresh fish and lobsters are brought in daily by local fishermen.

Dancing—A very popular pastime at the Hay Harbor Club and the Mansion House. On one evening each week a special dance for the children is always well attended.

The owners of Fishers Island strive constantly to keep the Island free from every objectionable feature and though from time to time modernized for the convenience of our guests, they plan to keep it as unpretentious as in the past. Those who know the Island are charmed with its natural beauty.

Churches—There are three churches on the Island: St. John's Episcopal, Roman Catholic and the Union Chapel. A circulating library provides guests the opportunity to procure all the latest books.

There is not a dull moment for anyone who cares to walk, drive, ride, swim, row, fish or sail, play golf or tennis. It is always cool and a resort where you can find health and happiness. Equally important also is the all-pervading air of comfort and refinement which cannot be described within the limits of this booklet.

The Cottages—There are thirty-one. Sixteen are arranged for housekeeping, with kitchen and dining room. Fifteen contain sleeping and living rooms only, meals being taken at the hotel located at a convenient distance and connected by concrete walks. It is unnecessary to bring service or linens for the non-housekeeping cottages as we take entire care, furnishing chambermaid, hall boy and porter service.

Non-housekeeping cottages contain from five to seven bedrooms, one or more bathrooms, two living rooms with open fire places, two or more toilets and a small kitchen with range for heating water for bath.

Housekeeping cottages contain from nine to fourteen bedrooms, three toilets, two or three baths, two living rooms, dining room, two fire places, butler's pantry, servants' dining room and kitchen. We supply china, glass, cooking utensils and blankets. Basements have set laundry tubs.

The cottages have a southwestern exposure facing the harbor and Sound. Liberal porch space, a beautiful and extensive view and just a short walk to the bathing beach and club house.

A Garage with individual locked spaces for each car is situated at the end of the Mansion House. A modernly equipped automobile service station is maintained in charge of expert mechanics where all repairs can be made.

While we have outlined but briefly the beauty and charm of this picturesque island and the comfort of its hotel, we trust we have aroused sufficient desire on your part to investigate personally. We shall be pleased to furnish further details and diagrams of cottages on application.

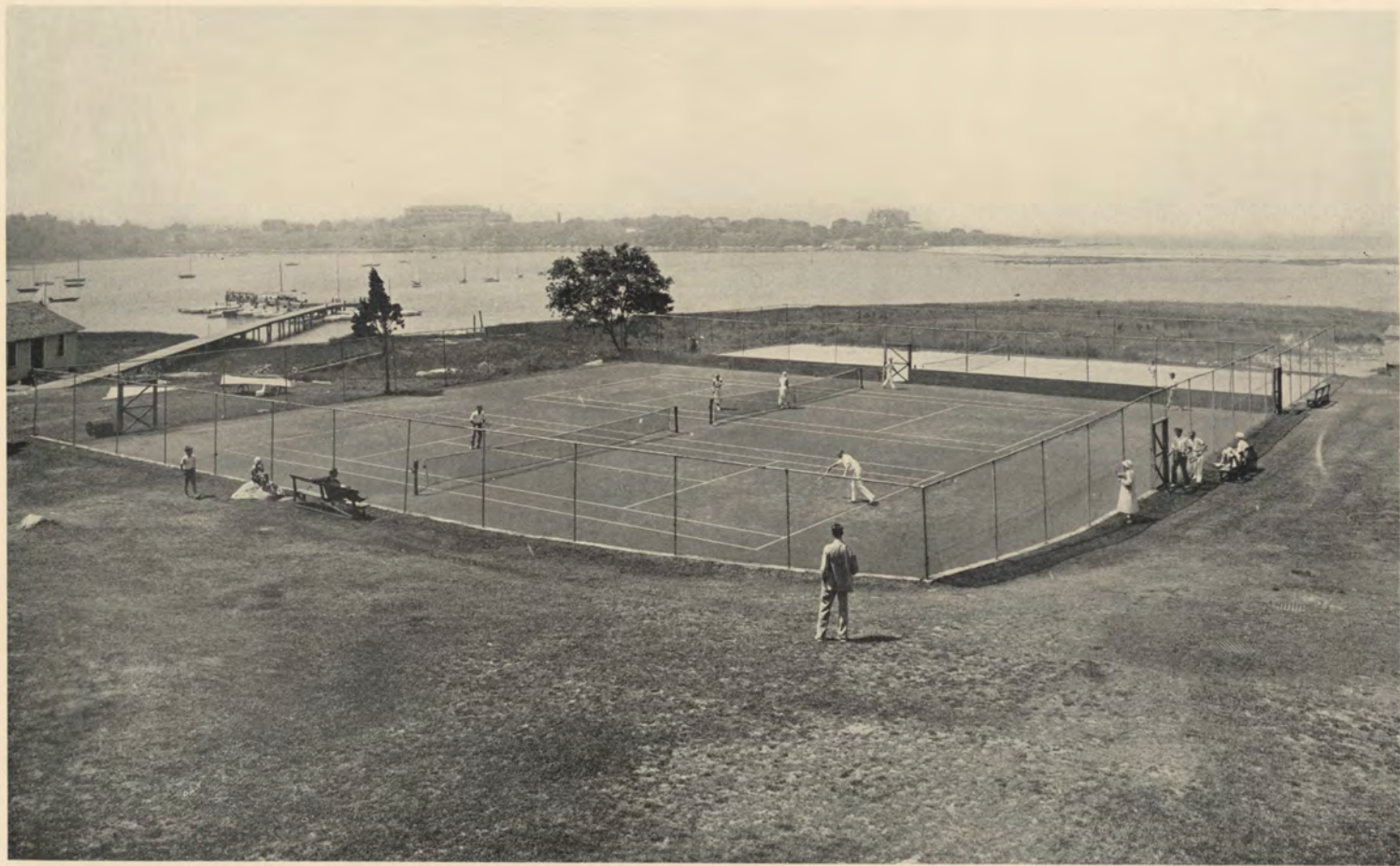

How To Reach Fishers Island

From New York:

In 2½ hours, via New York, New Haven & Hartford Railroad and New London Line Steamers.

From Boston, Providence, Worcester, Hartford and Springfield:

Via New York, New Haven and Hartford Railroad.

From Montreal and Brattleborough:

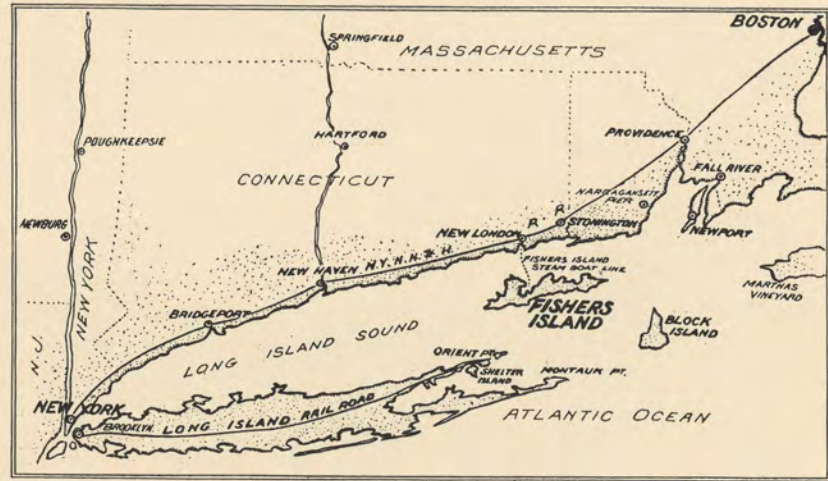
Via Central Vermont Railroad.

All connect at New London with the steamers of the Fishers Island Navigation Company, which make several round trips daily, leaving the pier in front of station and connecting with principal trains.

The Steamer "Fishers Island", 150 feet in length, has been built expressly for this route. It has accommodations for twenty automobiles, comfortable decks and saloons for passengers.

Baggage can be checked through to New London, Connecticut, by transfer company from all principal points on the New York, New Haven & Hartford, and the Pennsylvania railroads.

For motorists there are beautiful roads from all directions. Five hours from New York. Our porters meet all trains at New London and conduct passengers and their baggage to steamboat dock, which is directly at railroad station. Look for Fishers Island porter and give him your baggage check.



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
